














Cooperative Voter Education Project

The Cooperative Voter Education Project is a non-partisan campaign in concert with volunteer members of the Prince Georges' County Pan-Hellenic Council, the NAACP, and 100 Black Men of Prince George's County Equity Financial Services. The goal is to educate students and adult learners about voting and the current electoral issues and mobilize them to vote. The Brothers hosted multiple voter registration/education events in the months of September and October. Brothers hosted a voter registration/education event at Suitland High School on September 28, 2019, where 19 students were registered to vote. On October 3, 2019, Brother Michael Nelson spoke to groups of 11th and 12th graders at Frederick Douglas High School, where they registered 10 students to vote.

How Do I Register to Vote in Maryland?

Am I eligible to register to vote? To register to vote, you must be:

- A U.S. citizen;
- A Maryland resident; and
- At least 16 years old*.

You cannot have been:

- Convicted of buying or selling votes;
- Under guardianship for mental disability and found by a court to be unable to communicate a desire to vote; or
- Convicted of a felony and currently serving a court ordered sentence of imprisonment. (Effective March 10, 2016)

Importance of Voting— Why Everyone Should Vote

Voting is a fundamental right of any citizen that enables them to choose the leaders of tomorrow. Voting not only enables the citizens to vote for political parties, but it also helps them to realize the importance of citizenship. Many people do not vote thinking one vote will not make a change, but as a matter of fact, it does. A nation's political foundations are built using election process.

Voting is a basic process that keeps a nation's governmental system works. It enables the citizens to choose their own government. It also allows the people to choose their representatives in the government. The purpose of every government is to develop and implement various policies for the benefit of its citizens. It also enables the person with the right to question the government about issues and clarifications. Voting is the way to express the opinion of a citizen in a democratic nation. Voting is crucial to activating the democratic process.

Every adult is given the right to vote, irrespective of sex, class, occupation and so forth. It is a fundamental right in which all citizens get an opportunity to choose who represents them. It is the right, benefit and obligation to vote as a citizen of your nation and an individual from your society.

Stress and Black Men

The emotional stoicism of Black men is something that few authors have talked about. Most notable of the few books on the topic, the author, Bell Hooks' work, "We Real Cool: Black Men and Masculinity," discusses the lack of love and acceptance that Black men face, creating an emotional crisis. Many men have not been told how to process and talk about their emotional experiences, furthering a sense of isolation, anger, and resentment. For these men, this creates an emotional volatility that can sometimes manifest to seemingly "shut down" in relationships and friendships. At its worst, this budding resentment can manifest in outward expression of anger, aggression, and even violence. Bowling Party (May 2020)


PUL puts on a party for Brothers and their families to come out and fellowship.




